PLEASE NOTE: All students in Rainbow Schools in Kindergarten to Gr 12 are required to wear properly fitted non-medical masks indoors in school, including in the hallways and during classes.

Students are expected to bring their own masks to wear on student transportation and at school.

Students are encouraged to bring spare masks in the event one becomes wet or damaged throughout the day. Masks should be washed and dried on a nightly basis.

Staff, parents/guardians and visitors are also required to wear masks.

We will focus on hand hygiene and coughing and sneezing protocols for students. The use of shared classroom materials is permitted this year on a regular cleaning cycle. Frequent cleaning throughout the day will continue for high touch surface areas. If you send hand sanitizer to school with your child, it must be scent-free.

#### **OUR SCHOOL DAY**

Morning bus arrival and drop off All students enter via the parking lot doors between 8:15 and 8:25 am. The entry bell rings at 8:25 a.m. Students will enter the school immediately upon arrival.

### Morning late arrival

Please bring your child(ren) to the main entrance and buzz the office. The entry of visitors and families inside the school is still limited at this time.

Classes begin at **8:30 a.m.** and finish at **2:50 p.m**.

#### **Dismissal**

Students exit via the parking lot doors unless they are being picked up early, then they will be sent to the office where we will sign them out and bring them to vou.

Students who are being picked up will be dismissed first at **2:45pm** before buses.



For safety reasons, vehicles or families are not permitted in the parking lot.

We ask that you park on the street, being mindful of the bus loading zones. Thank you for parking on the same side as the school to avoid crossing in between traffic and the buses.



#### **BALANCED DAY**

With the Balanced Day schedule, students have two 40 minute breaks. The first break from 10:10 - 10:50am is considered a snack break. It should be nutritious, please no chips, chocolate bars, pop etc. Fruit and vegetables are great.

The second break from 12:30 - 1:10pm is their lunch. Pack foods that can easily be returned home if they are not eaten. It is better to pack too much than not enough.

Don't forget any utensils that might be needed. Please note, students do **NOT** have access to a microwave.

#### **ABSENCES**

Notifying the school is incredibly important when your child is going to be absent or late. We need to know that your child is safe. Although you have sent a note via Seesaw regarding an absence or late, please follow through with a call to the office to avoid that safe arrival call. Our answering machine is always on. If you are arriving late please come to the office with your child.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY is very important in a child's learning. Our school day begins at 8:30 and ends at 2:50. Even 5 minutes can make a difference in a child's learning. Please try to be on time and try to schedule appointments during PA days or after school.

We will continue to use the popular APP called Seesaw, to communicate with our parents.

Seesaw is a free APP that can be downloaded to your cell phone or your home computer and it allows quick communication between the teacher and parent. All newsletters and communication will be posted on Seesaw. If you don't have access to a cell phone or a computer, please advise us and we will arrange something for you. Your child's classroom teacher will be sending information home with further details. Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions.

#### **SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

Students require a backpack, lunch, indoor shoes, a full and labelled water bottle (can be refilled at a filling station fountains are closed), and two non-medical masks. All school materials will be supplied by the school. If your child wishes to bring their own school supplies, they must not be shared with other students. A reminder that toys from home are not allowed.
